Q. I didn't understand; you said that you heard about this, is that what I must understand? And if so, what did you hear?
A. I heard other people said that any Vietnamese who was found would be sent away to be executed.
Q. And who said that, were these people from the higher echelon, <from the chain of command?> Who told you this?
A. It's a word of mouth, everybody knew about it even in the mobile unit.

Q. So everyone knew or had heard that the Vietnamese, if they were found, would be arrested and executed; is that what I must understand?
A. Yes, that is correct.
Q. Now I would like to discuss the issue of discipline. Did you ever hear that there were units appointed to special cases -- that is to say, people who had disciplinary issues because they didn't work hard enough or they did not follow the rules? Did such units exist?
A. Yes there was.
Q. What was the status of the people working in the special cases unit, were they treated in a harsher way than the other workers?
A. Workers who were assigned to the <special_-case unit had to work full day during the day time as they were said that they <had night blindness> and that they couldn't work at night, so they had to work full day.

Q. Were these people <who worked> in the special cases unit requested to produce a higher quota than the other workers? We know that there was a general quota which was three cubic metres of <soil> per day that had to be transported. So, in the special cases unit, did these people have to <abide by a greater quota>?
