SUBJECT: International Co-Prosecutors' (ICP) Response Regarding Lifting of

Disclosure Conditions (E319/35/10) (CONFIDENTIAL)

- 1. On 20 February 2017, the Co-Prosecutors filed a request before the Trial Chamber to lift measures taken to protect the integrity of the investigation in Cases 003 and 004, namely redactions to transcripts and the use of pseudonyms with respect to witnesses who testified in court (E319/35/7). On 3 March 2017, the Trial Chamber sought the guidance of the International Co-Investigating Judge (ICIJ) as to whether the measures which apply to transcripts and witnesses in Case 002/02 may now be lifted in whole or in part (E319/35/8, para. 3). On 6 March 2017, the ICIJ requested that the Trial Chamber order the ICP to provide a list of witnesses and statements it seeks to have re-evaluated (E319/35/9.1, para. 4). Given an opportunity to respond by the Trial Chamber, the International Co-Prosecutor (ICP), on 24 March 2017, provided specifications on the witness designations he seeks to have re-evaluated (E319/35/10 et. seq.).
- 2. The Trial Chamber now requests the views of the ICIJ on the matters identified by the ICP (E319/35/10, para. 10). The Chamber takes note of the ICIJ's pressing workload and his indication that he cannot guarantee that it will be possible to respond with the required information within the timeline set by the Trial Chamber for the filing of Closing Briefs in Case 002/02 (E319/35/9.1, para. 5). However, based on the specifications provided by the ICP, the Chamber requests the ICIJ to respond, on or before 14 April 2017, or to inform it when a substantive response could be expected.
