Dear Professor Kiernan,

We refer to the current investigations conducted by ourselves concerning charges brought against five persons in two separate investigation files as noted above.

You will appreciate that, in the course of those investigations, it is our function to gather relevant evidence, documents or other material, whether copies or originals. The formal means of doing this is to issue a Rogatory Letter which authorizes delegates (generally our Investigators from our office) to find and submit the evidentiary material to us and which constitutes an obligation on the addressee to provide the material to which the Rogatory refers. Indeed, it is a necessary precursor to our being able to formally place evidentiary material on the case file.

Prior to issuing any Rogatory Letter and to assist us determine how best to proceed, we would be obliged if you would indicate to us the kinds of evidentiary material in your possession or control, whether this is copy or original material and the location of such material.
