Investigators: We, Bernard BRUN and SVAY Samnang, Investigators in the ECCC Office of the Co-Investigating Judges, in reference to the above Rogatory Letter, hereby report that on 15 June 2009, we interviewed Civil Party Roman Yun *alias* Kham Phi, who was designated to us by name. The interview was recorded on audiotape, and a written record of interview was produced.

Romam Yun, aged about 76, provided information regarding his role during the period prior to 1975, when he was a messenger for the Khmer ISARAK movement until the advent of Pol Pot. He described the method for receiving and dispatching mail and about the contents of the mail received by Pol Pot. He stated that during the Pol Pot regime, he held various positions as village chief, commune chief, district chief, and also as deputy chief of Region 101 in charge of economic affairs. When the regime ended, he was dismissed from his post and was on leave for two months, idle. He was then sent somewhere in Phnom Penh, but he does not know where. He was asked to do gardening for half a month until Vietnamese troops liberated Phnom Penh. He then returned to his native village. He also described the work he performed and the various plans he received from the upper echelon in the performance of his duties. He also explained the organisational structure for Region 101.

As for Civil Party KLAN Fit, we did not meet him as scheduled. We were told that he was ill by the coordinator for the Civil Parties. We later tried to contact him on several occasions again through Ms Emmanuelle Marchand, coordinator for the Civil Parties. We were told that she was unable to contact him.

Although we were unable to complete the interview of Civil Party Roman Yun, we observe that he does not seem to have a clear and precise knowledge of the information contained in his complaint. At times, he gives different accounts of the same event. This gives us the impression that his information is not reliable.

Although the mission ordered by means of this Rogatory Letter has only been partially executed and although we were unable to interview the second Civil Party (KLAN Fit), we consider that this Rogatory Letter will be closed by 27 August 2009. Should we receive any new relevant information, a new Rogatory Letter will be required. The Rogatory Letter Completion Report was prepared on 27 August 2009.
