Summary of Proceedings:

Nuon Chea's request to leave the courtroom:

Nuon Chea indicates that he will leave the courtroom and shall return when his Defence lawyers present the Accused's submissions. The Chamber granted the request.

<u>Ieng Sary Preliminary Objection (Ne bis in idem)</u>

The Defence presents its reply concerning its preliminary objection on the issue of *ne bis in idem*.

Ieng Sary Defence's request to allow the Accused to leave the courtroom

The Defence requests that leng Sary be authorized to leave the courtroom whenever he needs to, so that the Defence may present its submissions without interruptions.

Trial Chamber dismisses the request and indicates that it may grant leave to the Accused to be absent from the courtroom upon reasoned request, which was not the case.

<u>Ieng Sary Defence submissions on Preliminary Objection (amnesty and pardon)</u>

The Defence presents its submission concerning the preliminary objection on the issue of amnesty and pardon.

Submissions on admissibility of civil parties' application

The Trial Chamber indicates that, following the Lead Co-Lawyers' request concerning the list of witnesses whose names were decided upon by the Pre-Trial Chamber in its recent decisions, the Civil Party Lawyers may present their submissions at the end of the proceedings, if they so wish, indicating precisely the nature of the request they intend to make.

<u>leng Sary Defence request for leave to the Accused to follow proceedings from the holding cell</u>

The Defence for leng Sary requests leave for the Accused to follow the proceedings from the holding cell, due to back problems. The Chamber grants the request.

Co-Prosecutors' Response on Preliminary Objection (Amnesty and pardon)

The Co-Prosecutors make their submissions in response to the preliminary objection on the issue of amnesty and pardon.

<u>leng Sary Defence request for leave to the Accused to follow proceedings from the holding cell (afternoon session)</u>

leng Sary Defence requested that the Accused be allowed to observe the proceedings from the holding cell as he cannot remain seated more than twenty minutes. The Trial Chamber granted this request.

Civil Parties' Response on Preliminary Objection (amnesty and pardon)

The Civil Party Lawyers present their submissions in response to the preliminary objection on the issue of amnesty and pardon.

<u>Ieng Sary Defence reply on Preliminary Objection (amnesty and pardon)</u>

The Defence presents its reply on the issue of amnesty and pardon.

<u>leng Thirith Defence request for the Accused to be allowed to return to the Detention</u> Facility

Ieng Thirith Defence requests that the Accused be allowed to return to the Detention Facility because she is tired. The Trial Chamber grants the request.
