......in order to impede the socialist construction movement from advancing. As for the troops, [he] did not arrest those who took actions against the revolution and did not purge the opposing compositions. Doing so meant that he did not hold absolute stance and that the proletarian class was not strong because his CIA stance was strong. He was stubborn, and he kept them in order to gain benefits from building embedded forces. Meanwhile, the damage by fire of the crops such as corn, yam, coconut, mango and so forth was still continuing because the traitorous cliques did the traitorous activities against the Party and made suggestion in accordance with the slogans created by the traitorous cliques to attack the socialist revolution. Consequently, they were active in destroying the Party's property of any kind, even an ear of corn and a bulb of yam.

This was my communication with comrade  $Sim(\c N)$  in the past in order to take actions to oppose the Party that I knew. Besides, Sim and  $Brother Tum(\c N)$  contacted each other directly regarding the joint coup plan to fight the Party in Phnom Penh in January 1977. I was not sure about the tasking of the 152nd concerning the joint coup plot. I was not sure whether they worked together to cooperate with the other traitorous divisions against the Party or if they took action to attack the Party.

I would like to end my report to the Party.

The Summary of the Responses of Hoeng Doeun (র্জন্ম হার্টিন্ত) alias Dim (ইঞ্চ)

**Deputy Secretary of Division 164** 

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On His History From the Beginning Until His Arrest by Angkar

Transcribed on: 1 August 1977

......Communist in appearance but CIA in essence (Page 2)

In February 1968, he [Doeun] had a meeting with Tum (資) and Mut (質節) behind (質別) Phon's house.

The meeting contents:

- 1. Angkar decided to launch the fighting. The East Zone had to establish the army. Therefore, Ly  $(\vec{\Omega})$  would be assigned to infiltrate to grasp the military movement.
- 2. The Sector 22 was responsible for bringing the weapons further to the Zones. Therefore, Mut would be responsible for that and would not destroy anything which would lead to exposure.
- 3. It was requested that by the end of 1969, all Party members would be turned into CIA networks. (Pages 8-9)

The repression method against the Party members was that they would not dare take any actions or they would be forced to stay still for their own sake or they would oppose the revolution if possible. (Page 11)

After the meeting, they refashioned Chao Soeun (មៅ ស្បើន), Secretary of Ou Reang Ov (អ៊ូវរ៉ាងឱ) district; a child of the deputy [of commune]<sup>1</sup>; his background: staying still for his own sake. He was inducted as the CIA in 1969. Chao Soeun took actions to repress the revolutionary base located in Boeng Kang (បឹងកាង) village and Srae Mien (ព្រែមៀន) village. (Page 11)

......having discussed the possibility to stage the coup, they were able to win 100 percent. However, if they lost, they would continue their fighting for a long time and seize the North Zone and East Zone for their supporting base along the borders between Mekong River (守頂斯山) and Tonle Sap River (守頂和山).

The targets were as follows:

- 1. Try to inquire at the respective targets and try to do training in the Special Combating Unit techniques;
- 2. Get ready to prepare weapons, ammunitions and transportation networks;
- 3. The Command Committee consisted of the following persons: (Page 166)
  - Tum (ម្នំ): Chairman
  - Doeun (ឡើន): Deputy Chairman
  - Saom (សោម): Member
  - Oeun (អឿន): Member

At the end of November 1976 when he [Doeun] finished his study sessions, Tum called Doeun to visit him for one night. (At the end of page 167)

Tum told Doeun that:

- 1. The Central Committee, what Tum told him before was wrong, that the Central Committee was overt.
- 2. The Central Committee was in fact secret, and consisted of the following persons: (Page 168)
  - Brother Phim (ភិម): Chairman
    [Translator's note: missing one page]

......"Phnom Penh Mean Ka" (ភ្នំពេញមានការ) was the secret radio recognition sign they used ,but he kept waiting and received nothing.

At the end of February 1977, a meeting was held at Tum's house located in Tuol Kouk in which he [Doeun], Tum, (ស៊ុក) Sok in the 170, (សៅ) Săo in Logistics and (ស៊ីម) Sim in

152 participated. The meeting content was about the failure due to the disclosure and confession by Nhèm (ហ៊្លាម), (ឃុន) Khuon's network.

This reason was not quite clear yet because Khuon was just arrested on 25 January 1977<sup>2</sup>, while Oeun's cliques were arrested on 17 February 1977.

In April 1977, he came to join the 17 April Anniversary. Tum whispered to him, asking him to attend a meeting held at (NINS) Chhean's base in the Sector 22 in order to <u>listen to</u>

<u>Brother Phim.</u> (At the end of page 177)

On 19 April 1977, he came to join the Conference until 20 April 1977. During a break, Tum told him that there would be a meeting on 25 April 1977. However, he was arrested on 21 April 1977.

II. The Existing Traitorous Forces in the East Zone

He only mentioned those who used to stay in the Sector 22. As a result, it might not be widespread.

III. The Traitorous forces in Division 164 that he mentioned:

I would like to classify them into different categories as follows:

- A. The old networks that Yan (tins) and Chhan (Ans)—(tins) Chey's son—introduced to him:
- 1. Nhoek ( $\mathfrak{N}$ n): In the Sector 37; arrested; Chhan knew him through his father.
- 2. Hâm (ហម): Secretary of Battalion 170; arrested

- 3. Sarat (សារ៉ាត): Deputy of Battalion 170; arrested
- 4. Samnang (សំណាង): Member of Battalion 143
- 5. Hon (บุริ): Company; machine workshop
  - 6-9. Yân (យ៉ុន); Him (ហ៊ីម); Moeun (ម៉ឿន); and Sēt (សេត): Chhan's messengers
- 10. Phăn Si (ជាន់ ស៊ី): Secretary of Battalion 166
- 11. Heang (ពីាង): Assistant to the Division Office
- 12. Hort (ហ៊ីត): In charge of radios in Regiment 63

He [Doeun] did not mention the biography of all of these persons above. They were introduced by Yan and Chhan. However, he did not mention in the text their communications and activities with him or other traitorous networks.

- B. New persons whom he indoctrinated directly and who took actions with him subsequently:
- 1. Meanh (ម៉ាញ): Secretary of Regiment 63. There was no any weak point in this person's biography. According to his confession, the fact that Meanh came to contact him first suggested that Meanh was an old line. However, he did not clarify that.

Moreover, Meanh was responsible for the islands. Consequently, this could be relevant to the traitorous activity (as he mentioned in his plan that he would use the islands as the base). He implicated Meanh in his traitorous intention to control the islands because there was nobody else to be implicated or because Meanh had a conflict with him ............\

- C. New networks introduced by Manh:
  - 1. Yeun (យ៉ឺន): Secretary of Battalion 622
  - 2. Norn (SS): Secretary of Battalion 621
  - 3. Torn (98): Deputy Secretary of Battalion 623

He did not clarify their biography and subsequent activities.

#### Conclusion:

His confession was lengthy but basically in sequence. Furthermore, he mostly spoke about the traitorous lines in Sector 22 and those who left Sector 22 and Division 164. He talked little about leading cadres in 203, as the above-mentioned observation shows.
