I would like to give supplementary information related to crimes committed during the Democratic Kampuchea era as follows:

In mid-1976, when the Khmer Rouge had the policy of Vietnamese- Khmer swap with Vietnam, my six family members and hundreds of families in Kampuchea Krom were arrested by Vietnamese soldiers and brought to the Khmer Rouge troops through Phnom Den () border crossing. Then, the Khmer Rouge transported my family by car to do hard work in Trapeang Thom Khang Cheung cooperative, Tram Kak district until the collapse of the Pol

Pot regime. At that location, the Khmer Rouge forced me to move around and collect pig dung, carry termite mound soil and harvest rice in terrible conditions.

In late 1978, my elder brother IEM San (销货 机路), my aunt IEM Peou(销货 筑), my cousin IEM Naun(销货 机路) were forced by the Khmer Rouge to marry the persons whom they had never known before, at Trapeang Thom Khang Cheung cooperative, Tram Kak district. The forced marriage was organized for 25 couples including my elder brother, aunt and cousin. It started from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.

My uncle was married to a Vietnamese woman before 1975. Then on 17 April 1975 his entire family was forcedly evacuated from Phnom Penh city to Siem Reap province. They lived there for about one year; in 1976 his wife was killed due to her Vietnamese nationality.
