I would like to give supplementary information related to crimes committed during the Khmer Rouge regime as the following:

On 15 April 1975, the Khmer Rouge forced my family and me, along with other people from Phnom Penh, to live in Chi Mreak (ជីទ្រាក់), Kampeang (កំពែង) Commune, Kiri (គីវី) District.

At the end of 1977, they sent us to live in Trapeang Trav (ត្រូវ៉ាំងត្រាវ) Village, Trapeang Thum Khang Cheung (ត្រាំាំងធំខាងជើង) Commune, Tramkak (ត្រាំកក់) District, Takeo Province. About five months later, my Team Leader, named Pon (ប៉ុន្ត) ("in the VIF, he is called Bon"), told me to attend a meeting. Then a person named Sē (稅) ("In VIF he is called Seng") arrested me and tied me up. He Original KH: ERN 00581840-00581842

sent me to a prison (the name is unknown) in Trapeang Thum Khang Cheung Commune for three months. At the prison, both my feet were shackled, and so were the other 100 prisoners. Later, I was released by the Khmer Rouge to work (carry buckets of water) at the prison. During that time, I often saw the Chiefs of the Prison, named Mēng (ម៉ែង), Chhoeung (ឃើង) and Nau (ណ្), tie five prisoners up and send them to be killed on Damrei Romiel (ដំរីវម្សើល) Mountain west of Krang Ta [illegible] (ប្រាំងតា...). They did that every two or three days. Some of the prisoners I saw were Kăn (កាន់), Bǐn (ប៊ីន) and Meuk (ម៉ឺក), who used to live in my village.

At the end of 1978, my niece, named IEM Peou (អៀម ហៅ), who is currently living in the same village, was forced by the Khmer Rouge to marry Chheam (ណម), whom she had never met. The couple matching ceremony was in Trapeang Trav (ត្រពាំងត្រាវ) Village, Trapeang Thum Khang Cheung Commune, Tramkak District, Takeo Province.

My nephew, named CHĂO Ngăn (ថៅ ង៉ាន់), married a Vietnamese in Pou (ពោធិ៍) Village,
Angkeu (អាងគឺ) Commune, Tin Bieng (ទិន បៀង) District, Ang Yang (អាងយ៉ាង) Province. In April
1978, the Khmer Rouge gathered them to live in Kampeang Village. One month later, they took my
nephew's wife, along with the other approximately 50 Vietnamese, to be killed in Our Ansa (អូវអន្សា)
Village, Kouk Prech (កោកព្រិច) Commune, Kiri Vong District, Takeo Province.
