### Summary of Proceedings

### Opening of hearing and report on attendance of the Parties

The President opened the proceedings and the Greffier informed the Trial Chamber that all Parties were present, with the Accused NUON Chea present in the holding cell.

## NUON Chea Defence request to follow the proceedings from the holding cell

The Trial Chamber granted NUON Chea's request to waive his right to be present in the courtroom and to follow the proceedings from the holding cell.

### Hearing of witness PRAK Khan (2-TCW-931)

The Co-Prosecutors, Civil Party Lead Co-Lawyers and NUON Chea Defence questioned witness PRAK Khan.

Oral ruling on OCP objection to questions asked to the witness regarding the content of S-21 confessions, which are presumed to have been obtained through torture

The OCP contended that there is presumption that all S-21 confessions by detainees were obtained through torture, whether they were beaten or not, insofar as they were detained under inhumane conditions that deprived them of their freedom and treated them as less than human beings. They had to endure the screams of other detainees being interrogated, they were threatened and tricks were used to coerce them into saying things. All these conditions would lead, the Co-Prosecutors argued, to their treatment falling under the definition of torture as set out in the Convention against Torture. The OCP therefore argued that any evidence coming from confessions made by prisoners at S-21 is not admissible regardless of whether or not they had been physically tortured during their interrogations.

The NUON Chea Defence attempted to differentiate statements made by the S-21 prisoner Chhon in his confession before and after he had been tortured by the witness, PRAK Khan (2-TCW-931) during his interrogation. The witness had previously testified that day that he had beaten Chhon with a tree branch after he had given an incomplete confession by Chhon. The Defence asked the witness whether or not a certain statement the Defence was seeking to use was made before he had beaten Chhon, and therefore not obtained through the use of torture. The Defence was relying on this statement to support their argument that the imprisonment of Chhon and other detainees was lawful as they were part of an attempted coup d'état against the legitimate government, which would have been a crime in any country. The Defence maintained that establishing this was central to their case, also in light of the fact that in the Duch judgment rulings were made to the effect that arrests and detentions as such were unlawful-which the Defence argues is not the case.

The Trial Chamber (Judge Fenz) ruled that the use of statements made by Chhon was in this case forbidden as they were tied to confessions tainted by the use of torture, with reference to the majority decision issued by the Chamber on the use of torture-tainted evidence.
