Mr. IENG Sary, through his Co-Lawyers ("the Defence"), hereby notifies the Trial Chamber that he reserves his right to object to any of the proposed witnesses listed in the Office of the Co-Prosecutor's Annexes 3 (witnesses - no protective measures sought), 3a (a witness for whom protective measures have been sought) and 5 (authenticating witnesses the OCP does not propose to summon at this time). Separate filings related to OCP Annexes 2 (experts) and 4 (Civil Parties) will be forthcoming. There are 246 witnesses listed in Annex 3 and summaries of their proposed testimony have not yet been provided by the OCP. It is therefore impossible at this stage to determine whether objections against any of these proposed witnesses are necessary.² The Defence has not been provided with Annex 3a and it is therefore impossible to determine whether an objection to the proposed witness listed therein is necessary. The OCP has stated that it does not intend to request the summons of the proposed witnesses listed in Annex 5 at this time. Therefore, no objection to the proposed witnesses in Annex 5 is currently necessary. Should the OCP announce at a later stage that it intends to call any of these proposed witnesses, the Defence reserves the right to object within a reasonable time upon being provided with summaries of their proposed testimony and summaries of their expertise if applicable. Should any statements by any of the proposed witnesses be put before the Trial Chamber,³ the Defence reserves the right to confront these witnesses.
